Colorado Fur Auction | January 2025

Summary

- The Colorado Fur Auction is an event held annually by the Colorado Trappers and Predator Hunters Association and sponsored by Colorado Parks and Wildlife.
- The 2025 Fur Auction is February 5-6 at the Lincoln County Fairgrounds in Hugo, Colorado.
- At the auction the fur of native Colorado wild animals classified as "furbearers" by Colorado Parks and Wildlife is sold to the highest bidders.
- All "furbearer" species can be killed in unlimited numbers, or without "bag limit," by hunters and trappers in Colorado every year.

Three Ways to Advocate for Wildlife "Furbearers"

1.	 Email the Colorado Parks and Wildlife Commission at <u>dnr_cpwcommission@state.co.us</u>. Respectfully let the Commission know your stance on "furbearer" trapping. Here are some talking points: Unlimited trapping of all "furbearers," including rare species like ringtailed-cats and pine martens, is not science-backed wildlife management. Trapping is inhumane and animals can wait in traps for days before a trapper arrives to kill them. CPW should not sponsor any event that commercializes wildlife and should withdraw their sponsorship. CPW should consider regulatory improvements to ensure sustainability of populations for years to come.
2.	 Share on social media and tag CPW Share the link to the <u>Furbearer Auction</u> on social media with a sentence or two about "furbearer" hunting and trapping and why CPW should no longer sponsor the event and should consider improvements to their "furbearer" management.
3.	 Write a Letter to the Editor What aspect of the fur auction upsets you the most? Write your local paper an LTE that can be used to raise awareness in your community.
